
Little Brother and **Homeland** by Cory Doctorow. This YA science fiction duology also features a teen hacker, Marcus, who fights against a massive government surveillance system. This is definitely a classic of the hacktivist fiction genre, and shows that teens can fight against the system, and like Silence the Six, it brings up ethical issues related to surveillance and hacking without being too preachy.

The Silence of Six by E.C. Myers. This book stars Max, who finds himself on the other side of a government-corporate witch hunt after his best friend's death, and he has to use his hacking skills to survive. It also does a really nice job walking the line between technobabble that non-coder-teens would find off-putting and "bam, magic!" sort of unexplained computing concepts that come off as unrealistic.

Knights and Bikes: Knights and Bikes is based on a computer game of the same name. It tells the story of two girls who undertake an exciting adventure on the island of Penfurzy. Demelza expects nothing exciting to happen on the island, until she meets a like-minded friend called Nessa and the pair dream up an adventure together. 



National Theatre - All About Theatre



Gracie and her friend Daniel have always been warned to stay away from the Birdman and his side of the island. But then they find a message in the sand and discover the Birdman is not who they thought.



Rebellions and Revolutions by Jack Gray - This is a study of China from the 1800s to the present day. It focuses on China's problems of development - the decay and collapse of the Chinese Empire, its failure to recover in the first half of the twentieth century, and its rapid emergence in world affairs since the Communist Party Revolution of 1949. This new edition examines economic growth, updates Chinese foreign policy, provides a revised account of the Tiananmen Incident, and brings the chronology completely up to date.
