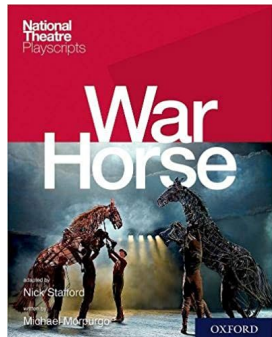
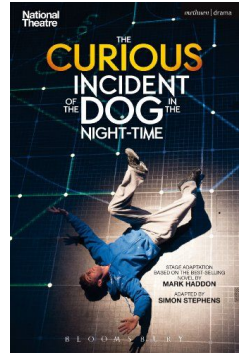


The Woman in Black Adapted for the stage by Stephen Mallatratt from the book by Susan Hill

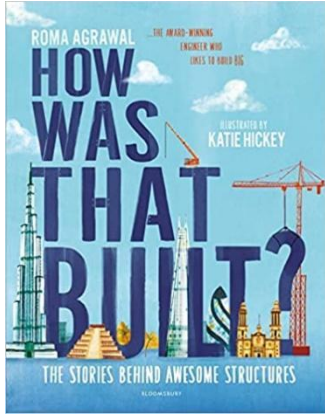


War Horse by Michael Morpurgo adapted by Nick Stafford

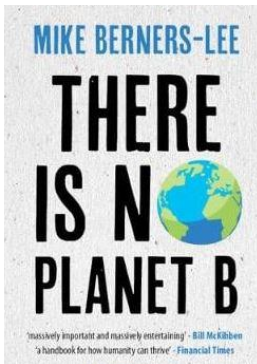
Horrible Geography - Violent Volcanoes : Anita Ganeri

***The Shadow King* by Maaza Mengiste** - With the threat of Mussolini's army looming, recently orphaned Hirut struggles to adapt to her new life as a maid. Her new employer, Kidane, an officer in Emperor Haile Selassie's army, rushes to mobilize his strongest men before the Italians invade.



***The Book Thief* by Markus Zusak** – Narrated by death. Fostered, with parents taken away, a young book thief called Liesel lives in a community in Germany that death is visiting.



***A Village in the Third Reich* by Julia Boyd with Angelika Patel** – an extraordinarily intimate portrait of Germany under Hitler, shining a light on the lives of ordinary people. 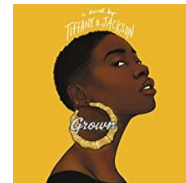
Let Me Hear a Rhyme

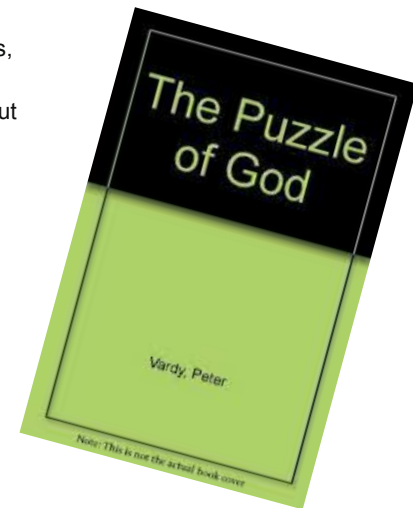
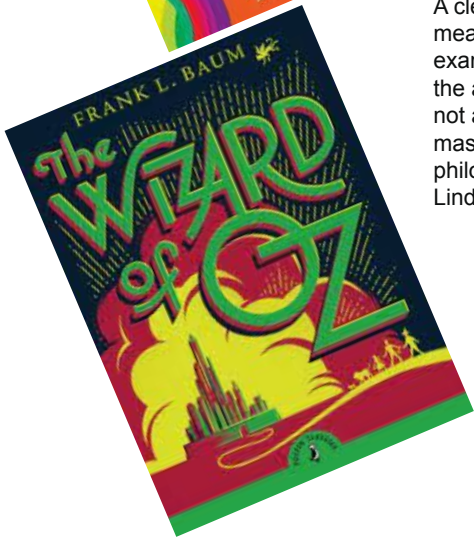
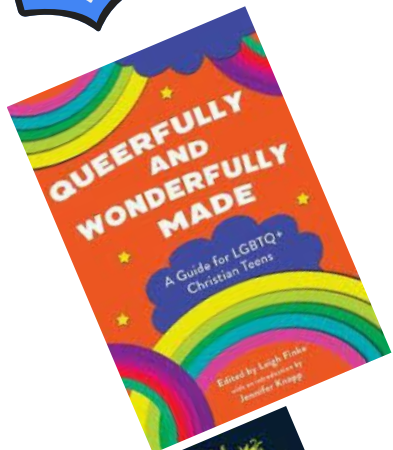
The Puzzle of God

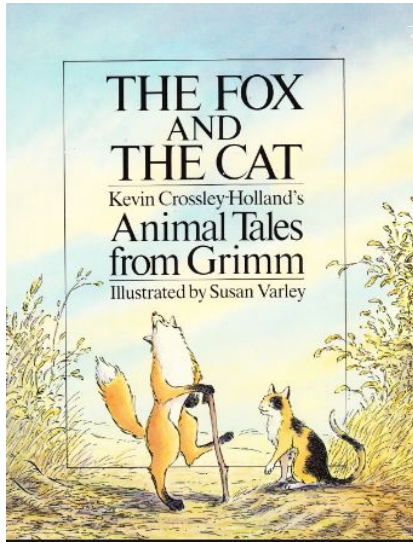
The Wizard of Oz

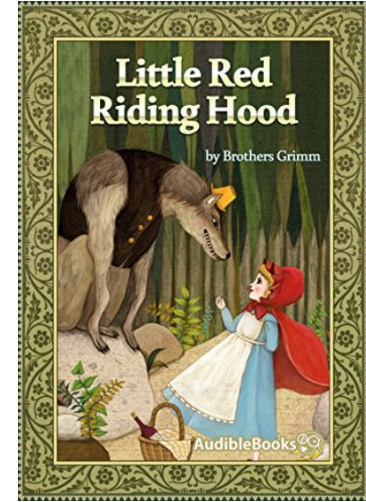
