- 54% A*-B grades
- 76% A*- C grades

Grades peaked nationally in 2020 and 2021, with CAGs and TAGs. Grading remained generous in 2022, with a movement back to 2019 levels in 2023. We were pleased that our KS5 grading was in line with 2019 for A*-B and was higher than 2019 for A*-A and A* - C.



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University Applications - 2023

- Universities taking longer to get back to students.
- A decline in offers from top universities including UCL, Kings College and other Russell group universities due to competition.
- Most students getting to choose a firm and insurance offer due to careful selection and ensuring their insurance is lower in terms of predicted grades.


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Horsforth Quadrant - Monitoring effort vs progress
