
The next set of exams you have are the trial exams at the end of November / beginning of December. See the exams page in the student zone of the school website for the latest exam timetable.

(It will help if you print off the exam timetable and exam board name and code numbers before you complete this part.)




When you have finished you should have something that looks a bit like this;

Make your revision / study periods productive – activity and outcome based not time spent.....


Decide what your plan is for that study session so you have something to aim for, complete a mind map, set up some flash cards, complete ex 4a from the text book etc.
