Why Study Music?



Music is a valuable and challenging subject to study, the value of which is recognised by highly academic universities. It develops a range of valuable cross-curricular skills, including in-depth analysis, creativity, dedication, collaboration to name but a few!

In 2019, more Music graduates were in work / further study only 6 months after graduation than graduates of English, Maths, History, Classics, Philosophy, and even vocational courses such as Architecture,
Engineering and Computer Science!
