

How can you start your journey to being a student ambassador?



1. Clubs and Societies

You will have the opportunity to apply to be a student ambassador at the end of September.

One of the ways in becoming a student ambassador is to run a club or society in school (there will be lots of other opportunities too!).

The club or society can be for any year group!

You could set up a book club, an after school sports society, a debate society in Year 12, a school newspaper/magazine society, you may want to work with the executive and teachers on diversity and inclusion or looking at an LGBTQ+ society. It may be a charities club or even a Lego club.



Put together a short paragraph outlining:

- 1. What type of club or society are you interested in running?
- 2. Have you a potential name for the society?
- 3. Who else would be involved (this can be a group effort)?
- 4. What age group/year group would this be aimed towards?
- 5. How often would you wish to run the group?
- 6. What are your aims and outcomes for this group?
