





# Environmental sustainability week Daily update: Friday 15th November 2024

The final day of environmental sustainability week has been full of activities across all the schools. At Vyners, Year 11 sustainability prefects have been visiting tutorials, encouraging students to write to the London Mayor about the importance of sustainability; Year 8 students worked on their 'How low can we go' pledges; and Year 7 students worked on their upcycling projects. At Hermitage, Year 3 used recycled materials to design exo-skeletons; Year 6 students made pen pots using recycled materials; and the book swap took place where students could wear non-uniform in return for bringing in books to swap. At Oak Farm, the finals were held for the sustainable song competition and the school book swap was held. Ryefield students have been working on their posters for the school and Trust-wide competitions. Finally, at Field End, students carried out a community litter pick.
