As part of our ongoing commitment to safeguarding and digital safety, we want to draw your attention to an important update from *The National College*. They have recently issued guidance for parents and carers on a growing concern: **AI-enabled scams targeting young people and families online**.

As artificial intelligence continues to advance, so too do the methods used by scammers. These scams can appear more convincing and harder to detect than ever before. Children and teenagers, who are often highly active online, may be particularly vulnerable to these sophisticated tactics.

The National College's advice aims to help parents:

- Understand how AI can be misused in scams
- Recognise common warning signs.
- Support children in developing safe online habits.

We strongly encourage all families to review this guidance and have open conversations at home about the importance of staying alert online. By working together, we can help keep our children safe in the digital world.
