Subject Year 11 Museum of London History -Trip 28 October 2019

The History Department is running a trip to the Museum of London in order to compliment and enrich two key GCSE modules: Restoration England and Power and the People. The trip will include two 90 minute workshops run by experts at the Museum of London where students will be able to immerse themselves in the History of these fascinating topics including handling real Suffragette memorabilia.

Campaigning in London Workshop Itinerary

Handle real Suffragette ephemera and make conclusions on the Women's Social and Political Union's methodology, organisation and success. Using iPads, visit the World City gallery to create parallels between this movement and the Brixton riots in the 1980s.

Investigating Restoration London Itinerary

Explore everyday life in Restoration London through using the Great Fire of 1666 as inspiration. Handle primary evidence to investigate what life was like for ordinary Londoners in the overcrowded streets of 1666 before the fire at the Museum of London.

Students are to meet at **West Ruislip Station** no later than **8:30am** on **Monday 28 October 2019** and will be back at **West Ruislip** by **3.30pm**, from where they will be dismissed to make their own way home. Students will need to bring either cash with them to buy a ticket, or an oyster card with enough credit to make the journey into London and back. We will travel by tube to St Paul's station and walk the remaining distance to the Museum of London. Students are required to wear school uniform as well as sensible footwear and to bring a coat. Students also need to bring a packed lunch with them.

Vyners School has in place detailed procedures for ensuring that trips are well planned and that the health, welfare and safety of students is protected. A careful and written risk assessment has been prepared for this trip and adequate student supervision and insurance arrangements will be put in place.

It is expected that all students will observe the highest standard of politeness, courtesy and conduct at all times. Our students are representing Vyners School and it is expected that they will do everything in a way that reflects positively on themselves and the school. The School's Behaviour Policy continues to be in force throughout the trip. Should it prove necessary to send a student home for misbehaviour, parents / carers will be expected to meet all extra costs incurred. In the event of a student being refused participation on a trip before departure because of poor behaviour, any contributions already paid will also be forfeit.
