Covid-19 lateral flow test kit collection and reporting

As we remain vigilant in school, please ensure you follow guidelines at home and inform us if your child is ill or develops symptoms of Covid. We would also like to reinforce the importance of regular testing and reporting until the end of term and report the results to **NHS Track and Trace** and via the school Google Form here.

Start of Autumn term

At the present time the arrangements for coming back to school in September are below. A virtual assembly will be delivered to students next week with any further details shared in the bulletin on Friday. Please do keep an eye on Google Classrooms and emails during the last week of term and during the summer holidays as this is how we will communicate any updates or changes to the plans for September.

Tutorial time for all students will revert back to every morning from 08:30. Sixth Form students will all be expected to attend morning tutorial time every day. This time will be vital to share information centrally, hold assemblies and guide students through their post-18 plans. We will allow Year 13 students to leave site once they have finished any lessons and timetabled study periods for the day, as long as they are on track in each of their subjects areas and not required to attend extra intervention support sessions.

September testing and return arrangements for Year 13

The Department of Education is requiring all schools to do two LFT tests <u>on-site</u> in September. Testing is aimed at quickly identifying those individuals that carry the virus (who may well be asymptomatic). Swift identification means people can take the necessary steps to isolate themselves and hopefully slow transmission of the virus.

Most of you will already have been engaged in twice weekly covid testing at home since schools returned in March 2021. As such, students are very familiar with the process of self swabbing. Therefore, they will be taking their first LFT test in the Sports Hall in a fully supported and supervised environment and their second LFT test under the supervision of their tutor in tutorial rooms (when they will be given their home testing kit). Home testing will then continue twice a week until the end of September (when it will be reviewed by the DfE). All home test results **must** be reported to NHS Test and Trace (as they are taking over close contact tracing from schools after the end of term).

Results of the onsite tests will this time be available in 15 minutes. Due to the numbers of students involved, the school is unable to communicate the results of negative tests to parents. Parents will, however, be contacted **immediately** in the event of a positive test and asked to collect their child from school. Parents will be responsible for arranging the subsequent PCR test, which will confirm or deny the diagnosis. Children must self isolate immediately if they test positive on a lateral flow test. A child that subsequently tests negative on a PCR test, and who does **NOT** have any covid systems will be invited straight back into school and is not required to serve a 10 day isolation.

Please ensure that we have up to date contact details and inform us of any changes.

Wednesday 8th September (testing in the Sports Hall):

Come in for the first supervised Lateral Flow test in the Sports Hall and go straight home afterwards.

Thursday 9th September:

Attend school for the first full day of lessons with tutorial time starting at 08:30

Friday 10th September:

Normal school day. Arrive at 08:30 for tutorial

Monday 13th September 08:30- 09:15 (testing in tutorial rooms):

13C, 13F, 13G, 13H, 13M, 13W

Attend as normal at 8:30am. Tutors supervise them taking a 2nd LFT in tutorial. **Go to normal timetabled lessons straight afterwards** at 09:15
