

Headteacher's Update

As we come to the end of the third week of the term, I can honestly say just how delighted I have been with the positive attitude of our returning cohorts as well as the excellent start that our new Year 7 cohort has made to their careers at Vyners. I have visited dozens of lessons and spent a significant amount of time in the canteens and on the quad area during the break times, with much of that time spent catching up with our students. With only one or two minor exceptions, they all look incredibly smart and have settled into their learning routines exceptionally well.

Unfortunately, I was unable to attend the Year 7 Parents Cheese and Wine Evening yesterday due to the fact that it coincided with a joint Governors Education and Standards meeting, which involved governors from both Vyners and Ruislip High School. This was the very first of such meetings and has been designed primarily to ensure that both schools are able to work collaboratively to continue to raise standards and improve outcomes. Thank you to Miss Hawes, Year Leader and Mr Cahill, Assistant Headteacher for hosting the cheese and wine evening and Mr Davey, Assistant Headteacher and members of the Friends of Vyners for their support in purchasing and serving the cheese and wine. I very much hope that the parents who were able to attend the event enjoyed a productive and informative evening.

The passing of the late Queen has meant that this has been the first opportunity that I have had to reflect on the summer break with parents and carers. The six week summer period is always a busy time for any school as this is the time when GCSE and A level results are published and a significant amount of maintenance and upgrading of the facilities takes place. Indeed, we have spent over £250,000 during this period, which has involved a number of different projects including upgrading our boilers in the legacy building, replacing a large number of classroom projectors, upgrading the art work in a number of external areas, upgrading ceilings and lighting in the art corridors and decorating a number of areas

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including the new building, which included extensive wall protection. In addition, the entire school has been deep cleaned including all external windows. My sincere thanks go to Mr Seabridge and his facilities team as well as Miss Williams, Business Manager and Mr Fiaz, our Network Manager for helping to facilitate these works.

Alongside the maintenance works, our new catering company, Cucina, have upgraded the catering facilities and have been serving meals to staff and students, including on our staff INSET day. Whilst somewhat anecdotal, the feedback that I have received from the students about the new food offerings has been extremely positive but we will send out a more extensive student survey about the catering facilities towards the end of the half term.

With regards to examination results, it proved to be another exceptional year for the school with outstanding GCSE and A level results and without doubt the best set of combined results that the school has achieved. At A-level, over 65% of all grades were at A*-B and more than two thirds of all grades at A*-A. At GCSE level, 88% of all grades were at 9-4, whilst 75% were at 9-5 and 36% at 9-7. Parents and carers may well have read that outcomes nationally would be set between the 2019 outcomes (which was the most recent time that external examinations were sat) and the 2021 teacher assessed grades and whilst this was the case nationally, both our GCSE and A level cohorts were able to achieve outcomes that were above the excellent 2021 outcomes on all benchmarks. Whilst we are delighted with these (statistical) outcomes, we are more interested in what they mean for our students and we were delighted that the overwhelming majority in both cohorts have been able to progress onto the university, apprenticeship, sixth form or college of their choosing. My warmest congratulations to all students who received results this summer as well as their families. We very much appreciate how stressful it has been to be the first cohorts to return to external examinations but the outcomes were exceptional.

Her Majesty the Queen

I would like to thank Mr Beale for his contribution to the recent assemblies that helped the school community to both mourn and celebrate the life of Her Majesty the Queen. Thank you also to Mr Kunig for overseeing the book of condolence for the school community and a special thank you to Chris Perkins from Groundtel Ltd for his tribute to the Queen that was etched onto the Vyners playing fields. I hope that all families were able to spend some quality time together over the extended weekend reflecting on the life of the Queen. May she rest in peace.

Start of Term Reminders

I would like to gently remind all parents and carers that they should do their very best to avoid dropping off or picking up their children on Warren Road at the start and end of the day. We very much appreciate that parents who are new to the school will want to be there for their child at these times, but this should only be the case during the first few weeks. Thereafter, students should walk, cycle or take public transport and preferably travel to and from school with friends. If it is the case that a parent or carer does stop on Warren Road (or surrounding roads) at any time then they should ensure that they do not stop on the zig zagged lines immediately outside the school, should not park over residents driveways or reverse onto driveways including the entrance and exit to the school. We are continuing to participate in the School Travel and Road Safety Project (STaRS) this year

and will be promoting a number of activities with the aim of reducing the number of cars that travel into the area and, at the same time, improving sustainability and road safety.

I would also like to ask parents and carers to encourage their children to be organised and ensure they bring the correct equipment to school each day. The Office staff have been inundated with parents bringing items into school that their children have forgotten, such as PE kits, homework, books, etc.

How to register a sQuid account

Link your new account and add funds

01 Go to Settings

Go to 'Settings' in the pink menu.

If you are using the sQuid mobile app, please click the menu button (the three lines at the top left of the screen) and scroll down to 'Settings'.



02 Select Third Party Link

Scroll down to **Third Party Linking** and click the pink **'Link'** button.



03 Link your sQuid account To EDULINK

You'll be prompted to log in to EduLink to complete the linking process. Enter your Edulink One username and password and then click the 'Link Account' button.



04 Add funds to your sQuid account

You can add money to your account from a bank transfer or a credit or debit card. Click on the **'Top up'** link at the top of the page, select your preferred payment method and follow the online instructions.
