

Headteacher's Update

The half term break seemed to go by at an alarming pace last week but it was pleasing to see the staff and students return to school seamlessly at the start of the week. The autumn term always tends to be the busiest. It is the longest by a good two weeks, but there are an incredible number of activities in the calendar that we aim to fit in. Next week, as well as the Year 13 parent's evening on Thursday, we will be commemorating Armistice Day on Friday, which is the 11th November. Our Sixth Student Executive team will be visiting tutorial rooms throughout this period, selling poppies for staff and students who wish to make a donation to the Royal British Legion. If parents wish to support this they should send their child to school with an amount of money that they would like to donate.

On Friday 18th November, we will have our one and only non-uniform day of the year in aid of Children in Need. There will be a £2 voluntary donation to the charity for students who wish to participate. However, we are very much aware that this might not be appropriate for all families in the current financial climate so we will ensure that students are able to wear non-uniform with their peers even if they are not able to donate the £2. There will be a number of charitable activities taking place throughout the day led by students in the Sixth Form and some members of staff, which hopefully will ensure that we are able to raise a good amount of funds for this fantastic charity.

I would also like to make parents aware of our annual two day staff conference that will be taking place on Thursday 24th and Friday 25th November. The school will be closed to all students on these two days. This year will actually be the tenth anniversary of the staff conference at Vyners and all of our teaching and non-teaching staff will be engaged in development activities across the two days. Home Learning Survey

Thank you to all parents and carers who responded to our recent home learning survey. As always, we try to do our best to ensure that our policy and practices are informed by the latest guidance and research as well as benefiting from input from relevant stakeholders. At this point, we feel that it is important to provide feedback about what parents and carers have told us. We were delighted to learn that the overwhelming majority of parents (93%) see the value of home learning and closely linked to this 45% of parents of students in the main school (years 7-11) felt that home learning has a large impact on their child's life outside of school, which suggests that a reasonable balance needs to be met between studying independently and having the opportunity to engage in other activities outside of school hours.

The majority of parents who responded to the survey felt that the right amount of home learning is currently being set or that there is, at times, too little. Only 12% of parents felt that too much home learning is being set currently. We also asked parents of students in key stage 3 (years 7 and 8) whether they would prefer to only have home learning set in the core subjects of English, maths and science. 30% of parents responded positively to this suggesting that the majority of parents would prefer their child to have a broad range of subjects for their independent study.

The final area of significance asked parents about their preference for a home learning rota. The outcome here was relatively split with 55% of parents in favour of a structured home learning rota that provided their child with a definite fortnightly home learning plan (as a reminder, Vyners operates a two week timetable).

We have found the feedback from parents to be particularly useful. We will now use this information along with subject based information and research from organisations such as the <u>Education Endowment Foundation</u> to formulate our new policy and practices. As a reminder, the school's Learning Resource Centre and Sixth Form study room are both supervised for independent study until 5.00pm from Monday to Thursday. Remaining in school to complete home learning tasks is particularly beneficial for students who

do not have a suitable quiet space to study at home, need extra support to complete home learning or for those who struggle with motivation or procrastination. It would be great to see both venues full of learners throughout the remainder of the academic year. My sincere thanks to Mr Cullum, Subject Leader for Music for leading on this activity.

Sixth Form Open Evening

Thank you to all parents and carers of students in Year 11 who attended the Sixth Form Open Evening on Tuesday.
