# **GENERAL NOTICES**

#### Car parking in the local area

We recently had a small complaint from a resident about some students parking cars in the local area. We would ask that students remain vigilant about where they park and ask that they continue to respect the local residential area.

#### Uniform

All students are expected to comply with the **uniform code** as per the Student Handbook (Girls: Blazers/Smart Shoes/Smart Office Wear, Boys: Suits/Ties/Smart Shoes). # **YEAR 12 NOTICES**

#### In - class assessments

Year 12 will be sitting their next round of in class assessment for each subject area from Monday 30th January. Most of these sessions will take place in normal lesson time. Students who have exam access arrangements may be offered to sit these in the study room. For subjects where there is more than one class, they may have one exam time scheduled together, but a detailed timetable outlining these arrangements will be published to students beforehand.

Students will receive guidance from class teachers regarding the content and expectation for these assessments and assembly time will be used to reinforce strategies and guidance.

Alongside overall progress in class, teachers will use these assessments to indicate progress in the next set of reports which will go home on 10th March.

#### Student voice

There was a good representation from year 12 who attended a meeting with Mr Kunig this week to gather views from students, which we value to see what is going well and where we can make improvements to benefit the whole school community.

#### Year 7 buddies

We are delighted that so many year 12 students have offered their help to buddy up with year 7 tutorials starting next week. They will introduce themselves on Tuesday and then arrange a time to be available in the year 7 tutorial room to chat or meet up in break times during the week. We are grateful for the time they are giving to ensure that year 7 students continue to settle in well and have a senior student to turn to for advice or support.

# Early entry university application group

A huge amount of work is already taking place guiding students who have shown an interest in wanting to apply either to Oxbridge, Veterinary, Dentistry, Medicine, or to Russell Group universities next year. Mr Kelly has been guiding Maths students to engage with either online or in person courses run by universities, to develop their wider skills and understanding and Dr Abbas has organised for students to attend Physics & Astronomy taster events at Queen Mary University. Mrs Cox is holding student meetings and sharing information through dedicated google classroom areas. Ms Connolly met with a group of students on Friday morning to develop their wider reading and presentation skills. They will be researching information in groups and presenting this to the year group later on this term.

# Coping with unsuccessful applications

Receiving an unsuccessful application can be heartbreaking for our children, and in particular at a time when stress levels are so high.

# **Accepting and Declining Offers on UCAS**

Students will start seeing offers coming through now on UCAS if they have sent their applications. Students should receive replies about offers by **18 May 2023** and all decisions need to be made by **8 June 2023**.

Students do NOT need to make a firm or insurance choice until the deadline of 8th June meaning they have time to consider their options.

There are three different replies students will make on receiving all offers:

- **Firm acceptance** this is your first choice.
- **Insurance acceptance** the back-up choice to a conditional firm acceptance.
- Decline you'll need to decline any other offers you get.

We will hold an assembly to explain this process on **Thursday 19th January**. Information will also be sent home to parents.
