

Headteacher's Update

31st March 2023

I had the absolute pleasure on Wednesday of this week of watching the fantastic school production of the play *Tuesday*, which was written by Alison Carr but, on this occasion, was directed by Rhys Heal (11W). The hourlong performance was wonderfully executed by the students involved. It forms part of the National Theatre's Connections Festival 2023, which is a project that is intended to bring together some of the most exciting writers with the theatre makers of tomorrow. Rhys and his team will be given feedback on the performance before they take to the stage at the Lyric Theatre, Hammersmith on Tuesday 25th April. Congratulations to Rhys and all students involved in this production and my sincere thanks to Mrs Moore and Ms Pope for their support for this project.



The Easter holiday is also traditionally a time when students in Years 11 and 13 spend a significant amount of time preparing for the final run into the exam season. I have spoken to students in the past few weeks about how best to use their time in the weeks ahead. Research suggests that this is a good time to ensure that all revision materials (e.g. notes, flash cards, mind maps) have been completed so that the final month or so leading into each exam can be spent on 'high end gains', which is where students apply their knowledge using practice papers. It is worth noting that this is often a testing time for students, which may mean that they are not always open to parental support. However, checking on their wellbeing, offering rewards such as snacks and drinks during revision is usually appreciated. Furthermore, after a revision session it is highly beneficial if a student is able to tell someone what they have learnt as this aids the retention of information. I would also like to thank all of the staff who have volunteered to lead intervention sessions for selected students in Years 11 and 13 during the Easter break. I do wish to remind parents and carers that students have been carefully selected for these sessions as they are interventions rather than general revisions sessions and whilst we do like to cater for large numbers of students, we simply do not have the capacity to do so. If your child has been selected to attend an intervention, you would have received an email from Miss Brown.

A Level Super Curricular Exhibition

A Level English Literature students had the opportunity on Thursday to showcase the impressive super curricular projects they've been working on this year. These projects enable students to broaden their subject knowledge beyond the exam syllabus while also developing vital transferable skills: public speaking; carrying out independent research; working collaboratively; developing their digital and creative skills.

Year 12 students have been exploring classical Greek and Latin texts and the Nineteenth Century novel this year; Year 13 began the year with a project on mediaeval and renaissance texts.

Film highlights of the super curriculum exhibition included a 1980s adaptation of 'Dr Fautus', recorded by Year 13 students in Ruislip Woods and a documentary comparing the novels 'Pride and Prejudice' and 'Our Mutual Friend' where Year 12 students posed as literary experts. Podcasts created were also of an incredible standard with discussion of topics ranging from the representation of Frankenstein's monster, to repression in the novels of the Brontes. Students also impressed us with their artist's interpretations of literature and their creative writing.

During the exhibition, it was an absolute pleasure to be able to welcome back some of our previous A Level English Literature students, currently at university. We were joined by Kathryn Dungey, Helen Caines, Benjamin Surguy and Tara Goolamali who spoke about effectively preparing for A Level exams, applying for top universities and university life.

It's a real privilege to work with students - past and present - who demonstrate such dedication, talent and creativity.
