Absence Line - Exam Absence or Lateness

If your child is ill on the day of an exam, please contact Miss Alonso or Mrs Lopes on **01895 234342 ext 4244** no later than 08:00. They will be able to discuss the situation and help you to make a decision regarding whether to attend the exam. Please also use this line to contact the school if your child is running late for an exam. We can then advise on where to sign in to ensure that they can sit the exam in the correct conditions.

Entrance to School during the exam period

During Year 12 and 13 exam study leave, entrance to the school site will be either before the gates close for the morning exams or between 12:20 and 12:40 for the afternoon exams. Students

should wear Sixth Form smart attire, with their lanyard at all times when on site and avoid entering the school at any other time. Students are welcome to come in to revise when they do not have an exam to work either in the study room, when there is not a year 12 exam running, or in a free classroom.

Personal Statement guidance/ University Information for potential early entry students

Year 12 students who are looking at applying to competitive university courses for early entry such as Oxbridge/ Medicine/ Dentistry/ Veterinary etc.had the opportunity to attend a talk from Jackie Watson, an outreach tutor at St. Anne's College Oxford University this week to hear guidance about applications and personal statements.

All year 12 students will be given specific guidance during tutorial time and our UCAS days at the end of June to receive guidance to apply to all types of courses and apprenticeships.

A year 12 student review of the session

I found Jackie Watson's lecture on University preparation extremely useful; her enthusiasm for university life and her experience in supporting students was strongly conveyed as she guided us through life before, during and after university. Her emphasis on prioritising course enjoyment when choosing a university acted as a reminder that universities are an opportunity not a test and that we should look to university to help us gain knowledge we're passionate about. She also reminded us of the challenges of choosing Oxbridge, and made us aware of the heavy workloads, which allows us as students to come to our own conclusions about whether Oxford would be an appropriate path for us. In many ways, the talk itself was a test of our skills to prepare a personal statement, as we had to take notes on the experience and come to our own opinions about what was being discussed, so arguably it could not have been conducted better.

Jackie Watson also highlighted how a Personal Statement should be unique to each person, and how we should have a constant, detailed opinion, a factor which is arguably relevant in all of our future lives when finding a job. A huge number of resources was recommended to all of us, whether it was by book, podcast, or visit, so she even offered help with developing the content of our personal statements and not just the structure. Her powerpoint mainly had diagrams and pictures, so her free way of speaking allowed her to directly address us and (I believe) signified her genuine wish to help. Her regular pauses for questions and her detailed answers to these questions I think reduced the general fear that everyone holds about Oxford and Cambridge, as we had a relatable and attentive member of the Oxford community to guide us.

Overall, I believe the talk was both informative and in some ways a comfort, and I gained a lot from the experience.

Study Leave and Lessons until Friday 26th May

Results

We will **email results to each student via their Vyners school email account at 8:30am on 17th August;** this is the earliest time we are legally able to release the grades. We hope this enables all students to have the information that they need to make decisions about their future choices. Students' individual university decisions will also be updated via UCAS track at 08:30. Therefore do not worry if you are away on Results Day.

On receipt of their results, students can request a call back from a member of the Sixth Form team via a Google Form which will be linked to the results email. Alternatively, the Sixth Form Team will be in school and available from 11:00 - 13:00 if they wish to discuss any issues related to their results. A link to the marking review and resit documentation will also be in the results email. Yearbooks and hoodies will be available for collection on results day.

Student Email Accounts

When the current Year 13 students leave Vyners in the summer, their email accounts will only be available **until Friday 27th October 2023**. On this date accounts and all data including emails will be deleted. There will be no exceptions to this rule unless students are doing retakes and still require access but you must inform us of this prior to 27th October, as once data is deleted it will not be retrievable by IT Support.

Please note that any files that students own that they have shared with others will also be deleted. Students can opt to transfer their Google Data out using Google Takeout. This requires them to have a personal Google Account.

It is the students responsibility to ensure they have enough space on their own personal account to transfer any school data.
