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#### Looking Ahead:


- Year 11 2023/24 cohort have had disruptions to learning in KS3.

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## **Trial Exams:**



- These allow students to demonstrate their ability and gain tailored feedback to strengthen their learning. They need to be taken seriously.
- Opportunity for students to **practice practical elements**: Exam conditions, locations, equipment, scanning etc.
- Exam timetable, and a topic summary will be sent home Friday 13th October
- Each subject will outline what topics need to be covered, as well as useful links and information to aid revision.



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# What are we doing to support your child?



- High Quality Teaching and Learning: Every lesson, every day.
- Consistent Assessment: Teacher, Self, Peer feedback.
- Home Learning: Tailored revision and application.
- Guidance for Next Steps: 1:1 Career Advisor meetings, exploration of careers in PSHE sessions, Careers Week, Careers Fair, Sixth Form and Subject Fair, 1:1 with a member of SLT to review their next step choices, interview days and external speakers coming in to discuss Apprenticeships and Local Colleges



- PSHE / RSE Sessions:
- 20 minutes weekly in tutorial time: Healthy Living, Consent and Healthy Relationships, Lifestyle Choices, Online Safety, The Impact of Drugs and Alcohol on Risky Behaviours.
- **60 minutes weekly sessions:** Careers, Revision, Money Management, Interpersonal Skills and raising Motivation with a range of 'Motivational Monday' starters regarding Goal Setting and Leadership.



- Building Resilience: Stamina towards exams.
- Pastoral Support: Pastoral Team, MHFA Trained Staff, Coaching, Counselling, Student Services Team, KS4 Vyners Wellbeing Google Classroom.
- Homework Club: Monday Thursday, 3-4 LRC.
- Explicitly teaching 'Study Skills' weekly and independent revision techniques.
- Running a variety of intervention and revision. These will be run by departments and will differ throughout the year.



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#### Intervention Vs Revision

- Intervention Targeted support with students. Selected students completing a specific piece of work or topic.
- **Revision** Support sessions that are designed to help students readdress topic areas and practice exam technique.
- These can take many different forms: Drop-in sessions, Home Learning, guidance on how and what to revise independently, during lesson-time and after school.
- Attending intervention and / or revision can only be beneficial if students are focused and completing work in lesson time as well.






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#### How to address these with your child?



# Alcohol, cigarettes, vapes and other drugs.







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#### PICK THE RIGHT MOMENT

With a younger child, the right moment can often be when they ask a question about alcohol or drugs.



Your teenager may think that they 'know it all', so you may need to wait for an opportunity to talk. For example, if you are watching a TV show that features subtle marketing, drug-taking, drunkenness or dependence, you could ask what they think about it. This approach is probably easier than trying to sit down and have a big talk.

You could also highlight the risks and ways to stay safe if they are going to a party or teenage disco.

If you find out that your child is drinking or taking drugs, this can also be a time to have a chat.



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#### MAKE IT A TWO-WAY CONVERSATION

Getting your child's point of view is an important part of any conversation about alcohol or drugs. Sometimes teenagers don't feel heard - listen carefully to find out what they know, what's happening with their friends and how they feel about alcohol and drugs. That way you can find out how best to support them.

#### **BE REALISTIC ABOUT THE DANGERS**

Your child needs to know the risks linked to alcohol and drugs. At the same time, if you over-exaggerate the risks, they may dismiss what you are saying.








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"Start a discussion ... be sure to take in their perspective. Be open and don't get angry. Come from a place of care."





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## **Attendance**




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#### Attendance:

# Students who attended Vyners School 90% or below on average got 4 GCSEs at Grades 9-4.

Students who attended 97% or above on average got 9 GCSEs at Grades 9-4.



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## **Practical Support for Your Child**



- Do they have all of their equipment?

- A place to work at home where there are fewer distractions.
- Good working routines including: *regular* bedtimes, homework time, free time.
- Do they know where and how to access th subject material to revise?





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#### Conversations about how GCSEs are a 'stepping stone'

- *Every* GCSE your child sits is important.
- The more GCSEs they have, the more options they have moving forward.
- This also helps their Average Point Score if they are considering a Sixth Form as their next step.
- It provides different pathways in the future.


