

# Headteacher's Update

I always enjoy the opportunity to speak to students in Year 11 (and Year 13) at this time of year as they prepare for the run in to their trial examinations. This morning, I took the opportunity to speak to the year group about some aspects of their trial examinations and discussed some of the 'mind traps' that many students fall into as they approach the examination season. One example of this is the fixation on grade boundaries. Students often use grade boundaries from previous years as a measure of the marks that they need to achieve a specific grade. Whilst this is perfectly natural, the reality is that this can be misleading.

The reason for this is that whilst examiners go through rigorous processes to try to write exam papers of a similar standard each year, ultimately, they do not know the standard until the papers are sat by the exam cohort. Therefore, if we take a subject such as English Language, the exam board will collect approximately 80-90% of the marks awarded on papers before setting the boundary for each grade. This allows exam boards to ensure that they maintain a similar standard each year and can prevent grade inflation. This is commonly known as comparative outcomes. The key message for the students (at both GCSE and A level) is not to become fixated with historical grade boundaries and be more focused on strategies to increasingly accumulate raw marks. Grade boundaries should only be used cautiously when planning ahead for external examinations.

I am also very much looking forward to starting my 1-to-1 next step meetings with Year 11 students next week; I know that these have already begun with other senior colleagues and, whilst they do take up a considerable amount of time, these meetings are something that I really look forward to each year as we seek to support students post trial exams and help them to explore their next steps post-16 and beyond.

Finally, I would like to think all parents and carers of students in Year 11 for the engagement in the

consultation evening yesterday. I hope that all parents found the conversations to be constructive and beneficial. I would also remind parents and carers that they can contact staff at any time of the year if they require a more in depth discussion beyond the five minutes that we are able to allocate on consultation evenings.

### **Year 13 Trip to the Freud Museum**
