## Headteacher's Headlines 16th September 2016

It has been great to see how well our Year 7 students have settled in to the school and whilst it is no doubt challenging for them to keep up with all the new routines, they are making a good transition to Vyners. It has been particularly challenging in the extreme heat this week with their blazers and numerous bags but they have managed well. On Wednesday they had their Co-Curricular fayre which gave them the opportunity to find out about the array of clubs and activities on offer to them outside of lessons. There was a fantastic buzz in the school hall and their challenge now is to try to organise their time and narrow down their options. The expectation is that every student participates in at least one co-curricular club and commits to it for at least a term.

It was a real privilege to welcome back one of our alumni as guest of honour at our annual Awards Evening last night. Sue Cook attended the school from 1961-1967 as one of the first cohorts when the school first opened. After graduating from the University of Leicester she went on to become one of the UK's most experienced and popular broadcasters. Sue's career began as a producer, presenter and DJ for Capital Radio. From there, she was headhunted by the BBC where she presented a range of programmes and documentaries for Radio 1, 2 and 4. In 1978 Sue moved across to television and has been a familiar face on many popular BBC shows including the groundbreaking Nationwide, Breakfast Time and more recently, The One Show. Her interviewees have encompassed politicians and celebrities ranging from Arthur Scargill to Archbishop Tutu and from James Stewart to Michael Caine. In November 1982, and every November for the next thirteen years, Sue co-hosted the BBC's annual Children in Need appeal night with the late Sir Terry Wogan. In the summer of 1984 she and Nick Ross launched Crimewatch



UK, which she presented until 1996. Sue has gone on to publish two novels and still finds time to support a number of charities.

Sue spoke to the audience about her fond memories of her time at Vyners including freezing cold trips to the outdoor swimming pool at Uxbridge, metalwork and engineering classes and the inspirational teachers that helped shape her. She reassured the students that she was a 'spindly eleven year old girl' who lacked self-belief but by being given the confidence to 'plough her own furrow' and believe that anything was possible, went on to achieve incredible success. Our Head Girl, Jasleen Chaggar gave an accomplished vote of thanks on behalf of the students, saying that the fact that Sue had walked the same corridors, sat in the same classrooms as they were doing now, inspired them to aspirational goals. The event was a wonderful occasion and I would like to congratulate all the award winners for their commitment and dedication over the last academic year. Thank you also to Dr Malhi, Mrs Boyes, the Premises team, Lee Sansom Year 11 and Oliver Latham Year 9 for all their work in organising the event.

I am delighted to report that the DfE has today announced that our collaborative bid with Haydon, Northwood, Ruislip High and Queensmead schools, to open a new secondary school, Hillingdon High, has been granted approval by the Secretary of State for Education. This reflects the commitment of these founding member schools to establish another high-performing school in the North Hillingdon area to help address the shortage of places for 11-18 year olds. Our application had the support and confidence of local residents who expressed their preference for a non-selective, inclusive school. The next phase will be for a site to be identified. The Headteachers and Academy Trusts of the five schools will now work closely with the DfE, EFA and Local Authority to secure a suitable location and begin the process of establishing the Governing Body of the school. This is likely to be a long process and this announcement marks the first step in the pre-opening phase for the new Free School. I will be writing to parents next week with further information and more details will emerge in the coming weeks as we liaise with the DfE.
